Dear friends and family members,

now we are a little bit more than one month in Kapkuikui, and it is amazing to see with which love and heartiness the people are welcoming us again and again. On the day when we arrived there have been two pastors, two church elders, the village chief, almost 30 children and 9 youngsters to welcome us heartily. Everybody wanted to greet us and to help us. It was like a big family and everybody was helping each other that after a short while everything was brought in our new home.

In the first two weeks here there were school holidays. The leader of the Sunday School of Kapkuikui were asking me for balls and materials for games and almost every afternoon he was making games and sports with the children. More than 50 children came and played football, volleyball, twist, family tennis and ...

In the evenings we were showing Biblical Movies in the church. Because of having no projector we were using our small television to show the movies... 50 to 70 people - young and old ones - were coming every evening to watch the movies.

Because we still don't have a car we are only working at the area of Kapkuikui for the moment. It is very difficult to find a car. Someone was offering a 27 years old car to us for 7,500 €, another one a car offered a car for 7,200 € to us for a car which is more than 17 years which had two accidents and the repair would have been another 2,000 €... Because Kenya is not producing cars by themselves the government takes a lot of taxes for the import of cars... and therefore the cars are very expensive and a car which is older than 15 years you can get for even more than 10,000 €... for our ministry a pickup would be the best car for us. But it is very hard to find a pickup! But God knows about this!!! Please pray that God will provide enough money for the right car!!!

There are 50 to 55 children who are attending the Sunday School at Kapkuikui. They are baby carried in a kanga and young teenagers... When the leader of the Sunday School was asking us we were separating the children in two age groups. Especially the older ones really enjoyed to be under themselves... They like to come and it is very easy to fascinate them... It is amazing to see how open those children are for God's Word... On Saturday Dani is meeting with Peter to prepare the Sunday School program for the next day. Peter is very open and very interested to learn more and more ... our cooperation gives us even a lot of fun ...

Outreach in Kapkuikui

In the beginning of May was a first crusade. Together we went to the center of Kapkuikui, we were singing songs Kalengjin (there is even a Kalengjin songbook), a few people of the church were sharing their testimonies, the pastor was preaching and we were introduced to the village. The people stopped to play cards and were listening to our program. The village people are very open for the word of God.

Several times Robert had the possibility to preach at the church. He really liked to spread out the word of God... Three weeks ago Robert was starting a worship team to start the weekly service with worshipping the Lord and two weeks ago he was founding a dancing group with children and youngsters. Meanwhile there are 31 dancers who are dancing and singing to the glory of God. Is that not amazing? The church is very happy to look at them.
